the Floy Farr Room of the Peachtree City Library. No registration required.



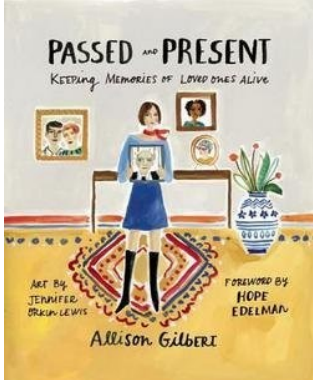

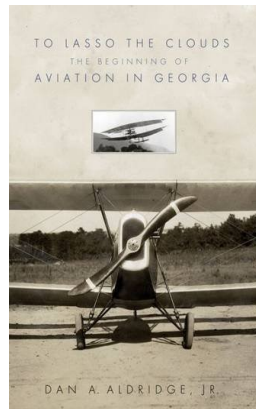


**Thursday, June 8th, at 6:30 pm**
